The Moral Imperative of Democratic Fairness and Good Governance

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The well-being of the American people depends on democratic fairness and good governance -- and the stakes are extraordinarily high in this era of rising authoritarian power and rampant political manipulation and betrayals of the public trust.

The Founders, drawing on Enlightenment ideals, recognized that unchecked power leads to tyrannical rule, so they designed the law of the land -- the U.S. Constitution -- as a safeguard against despotism. We must rightly reaffirm these foundational principles to ensure a safer, more just, more equitable and more sustainable society.

It is only through broadly fair, transparent and accountable governance that we can make sure that our society protects people's rights, freedoms and economic well-being -- and a sustainable future.

Those who advocate for policies that give most privileges to white people over all others, while vehemently opposing efforts to advance equity and inclusion, undermine the very essence of justice with actions that reveal a deep moral failing.

The Preamble to the Constitution is at the heart of American good governance. It lays out six guiding purposes:

1. To form a more perfect Union in an overarching commitment to unity, fairness and the on-going improvement of the nation.
2. To establish Justice and ensure that laws serve the people equitably, protecting against public corruption and abuses of power.
3. To achieve "domestic Tranquility" by creating a stable and peaceful society free from oppression and internal strife.
4. To provide for the common defense and defend the nation against threats from abroad while avoiding recklessly imperial militarism that serves private interests.
5. To promote the general Welfare by guaranteeing a reasonably level playing field of economic opportunity, education and public health and safety for all citizens.
6. To secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity and leave a fair legacy of a free and just society to those in future generations, NOT one ruled by anti-egalitarian oligarchy or ruthlessly tyrannical rule.

These principles are not relics of the past -- they are eminently ethical directives for today, and they require leaders and citizens alike to help uphold them against the creeping forces of corruption, exploitation and harshly domineering authoritarian control.

The Founders' Warning Against Tyranny and Corrupt Governance

The Founders were deeply aware of the dangers posed by unchecked power. James Madison, in Federalist No. 51, famously wrote that "If men were angels, no government would be necessary." Since people in power are decidedly not angels, a strong system of checks and balances is essential to prevent any individual or faction from seizing control and wielding it in ways that seriously undermine the greater good.

Thomas Jefferson similarly warned that "the natural progress of things is for liberty to yield and government to gain ground." This insight remains particularly relevant today as special interests and political power players, in cahoots with manipulative demagogic politicians, attempt to impose overbearing control and undermine democratic institutions, and suppress voting rights, and abuse and consolidate power.

George Washington, in his Farewell Address after two terms in office, cautioned against the rise of political factionalism, which he feared would lead to corruption, excessive division and the erosion of national unity. We see his warning playing out today, as hyper-partisan politics and the influence of Big Money and dark money threaten to replace governance of, by and for the people with governance almost completely centered on giving benefits to the privileged few.

The Ethical Mandate for Good Governance

A just government serves its people equitably, not selectively and discriminatorily. Good governance is not simply about law and order; it is about moral responsibility and ensuring that power is used in service of the common good, rather than for personal enrichment and the main benefit of rich people and corporate interests -- or the gratification of authoritarian ambitions.

Governance should rightly be judged by its ethical foundations:

- Does it serve all citizens equally, and protect the vulnerable?
- Does it resist the temptation of tyranny and self-dealing?
- Does it uphold fairness, transparency and accountability?

The Urgent Need for Democratic Fairness

Without assured democratic fairness, the very foundation of our republic crumbles. Elections must be free, fair and accessible to all -- not manipulated by contorted gerrymandering or by ruses that disenfranchise voters, or by misinformation, disinformation or concocted emotion-manipulating conspiracy theories. Laws must serve the people, not just those with wealth and influence. The government must prioritize the general welfare and the long term greater good over special interests and their focus on short-term self-interest.

Democracy is not an automatic process -- it requires the active participation of citizens. If we allow corrupt actors to violate democratic norms and dismantle checks and balances, we risk falling into the very despotism that the Revolutionary War was fought to escape. If we fail to ensure fair representation and just governance, we betray not just the Constitution, but the generations of Americans who fought for the rights and freedoms we enjoy today -- and all of our heirs in the future.

Thus, the question is clear: Will we stand up for good governance and democratic fairness, or will we allow our democracy to erode under the weight of corruption, misuses of power, shrewd authoritarian schemes, and unchecked influence by billionaires and the politicians they support and enable? The answer to this question will determine whether we fulfill the promise of the Constitution -- or betray it.

This essay articulates the moral, ethical and constitutional case for good governance and democratic fairness, and draws inspiration from the Founders while making it urgently relevant to the modern political moment. It is one of many essays in the Earth Manifesto in which Dr. Tiffany B. Twain urgently calls for a just, sustainable future, and warns against economic and environmental exploitation and unchecked capitalism that seriously undermines democracy and the common good.

The Ultimate Betrayal

When government is corrupted by greed, cronyism and abuses of authority, it severely undermines the moral and democratic values that define the American experiment. The failure to ensure democratic fairness -- whether through economic policies that enrich the elite while burdening the working class, or judicial manipulation, or voter suppression -- is not just bad policy, it is a moral failing that violates the fundamental promise of American democracy.

But since Inauguration Day on January 20, 2025, we have entered a dark and shameful hour in America's history. The Republican Party -- once the unyielding enemy of Soviet tyranny, the party of Reagan's defiance and the resolve of pre-Trump Republican patriots -- has been corroded from within, surrendering itself to the deceitful scheming and cultish abject servitude of Trumpism. Republican politicians have abandoned their principles and violated their oaths of office in order to now stand with destroyers of democracy, instead of with its commendable defenders.

The majority of Americans are watching in dawning horror as Republicans obediently march in lockstep with a leader who admires and envies strongmen, and who seems to despise the very foundations of our republic. No longer the party of freedom and aspirations for fairness, it has become a zealous accomplice to despotism, casting its lot with the likes of Vladimir Putin, Viktor Orbán and Recep Erdoğan -- men who deprive their peoples of rights and safety by wielding power like a bludgeon, silencing dissent and using state media to rewrite history and twist the truth to their narrow, greedy and power hungry purposes.

And it is not only in foreign policy, but also in many Project 2025 agenda items and in DOGE abuses of power that they are embarked on a subversive mission -- "to make the post-truth era the post-accountability age."

And for what? To serve the rich, giving them more public debt-financed tax cuts. And to cling to power at any cost, while tearing down the government they swore to defend. They have turned their backs on public servants and the vulnerable, and on our allies, our values and protections against tyranny -- on the very ideals of American democracy. This is not conservatism. This is not patriotism. This is treacherous betrayal.

The Historical Struggle for Democratic Fairness: Lessons from the Past, Warnings for the Future

Throughout history, the battle between democracy and authoritarianism has shaped the fate of nations. From the founding of the United States to the present day, this struggle has been defined by cycles of progress and regression, as democratic movements seek to expand rights and fairness while authoritarian forces and oligarchic factions attempt to maximize profits, entrench inequality, suppress opposition and abuse power. Those who follow the Authoritarian Playbook -- a recurring set of tactics used by autocrats -- present a grave danger and represent a stark warning for the U.S. and other democracies in the world today.

By examining these historical methods and patterns, we gain a deeper understanding of the threats we face and the moral and strategic necessity of defending democracy with vigilance and resolve.

History shows that when power is concentrated among elites, corruption and inequality rise.

The American Revolution was, at its core, a rejection of tyranny and monarchical rule. The Founders sought to create a system that would protect citizens from despotism, but from the beginning, there was a fundamental contradiction: the United States of America was founded on Enlightenment ideals of democracy, liberty and justice, yet slavery, economic inequality and far-reaching restrictions on voting rights undermined these principles.

Early America was dominated by landowning elites, and voting rights were restricted to white male property owners. This was an early manifestation of the Authoritarian Playbook, as those in power sought to limit democratic participation to maintain control.

The Civil War and Reconstruction represented a struggle between democratic expansion (abolition, Black citizenship and equality of rights) and authoritarian regression (Jim Crow laws and white supremacist backlash against fairness).

During the Gilded Age of the late 19th century, there was a rise of corporate oligarchy as industrialization and unregulated capitalism produced a new ruling elite -- tycoons in gargantuan corporate "trusts" who wielded enormous economic and political power.

Tactics of the Authoritarian Playbook emerged in full force in those days. There were corrupt political machines, like Tammany Hall in New York that for decades used bribery and patronage to control political affairs and elections. There were also gargantuan corporate monopolies like Standard Oil and U.S. Steel that crushed competition and manipulated lawmakers to protect their wealth and influence. And voter suppression and disenfranchisement of voters along racial and class line kept power concentrated in the hands of a few.

In response to such powerful influences, a laudable Progressive Movement arose that fought for democratic fairness and championed anti-trust laws, labor protections and expanded voting rights. The battle lines were clear: those in power sought to hoard wealth, while reformers struggled valiantly to restore democracy to the people.

The New Deal and the Post-War Democratic Expansion

When the Great Depression began, it exposed the failures of unregulated capitalism, leading to Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal, which redefined government's role in promoting economic security and democratic stability. Roosevelt countered the Authoritarian Playbook by expanding democracy, making it more inclusive and responsive to the needs of the people. He helped protect working people by empowering them with labor rights to improve the dire straits they were in, and he created a stronger social safety net. And he enacted fair election laws and economic regulations to curtail corporate corruption.

In the years that followed World War II, there was significant civil rights progress, and during the civil rights era of the 1960s, the struggle for democratic fairness took on new dimensions. There was a direct confrontation between democracy and authoritarianism, as democratic fairness was expanded with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which strived to end legal segregation and discrimination in education and employment, and the Voting Rights Act of 1965, which specifically targeted racial voter suppression, particularly in states of the South. And women's rights and environmental protections became new fronts in the battle for fairness and economic justice.

As always, there was fierce backlash by "conservatives". Southern segregationists and corporate elites sought to undo these gains by lobbying for policies they favored, and through legal loopholes, voter ID laws, gerrymandering and other forms of disenfranchisement.

A dramatic increase in corporate lobbying in the decades since then helped cement oligarchic control over democracy. Then, after the Supreme Court rationalized the use of virtually unlimited amounts of Big Money and dark money with its 2010 *Citizens United* ruling, democratic fairness has suffered severe setbacks, and election outcomes and policies pursued have been driven toward a highly undesirable hard right agenda.

This state of affairs has gotten much worse today, as efforts to expand democracy are being crippled and authoritarianism is being imposed on the country at a scary pace, and to an alarming extent.

The Destructive Impact of Gerrymandering on Democracy

Gerrymandering is one of the most insidious tactics of the Authoritarian Playbook in modern American politics. This is a deliberate manipulation of electoral district boundaries to entrench political power and unfairly distort representation. This practice thwarts the will of the people by allowing politicians to choose their voters, rather than having voters properly choose their representatives.

Gerrymandering creates "safe" districts where one party is virtually guaranteed victory, so it eliminates competitive elections and rewards political extremism. This has the extremely undesirable effect of stoking political polarization. When politicians are not required to appeal to a broad coalition of voters to win, they become beholden to the most radical elements of their base, making bipartisan cooperation nearly impossible. This artificially polarized environment contributes to paralysis in Congress, and poisons civic discourse. It also prevents cooperative problem-solving, as lawmakers have little incentive to compromise or seek common ground -- or govern fairly and effectively.

The result is a dangerously dysfunctional Congress, where gridlock, demagoguery and partisan brinkmanship replace meaningful good governance. This tragically leaves critical issues unaddressed, particularly including healthcare, infrastructure improvements, reasonable actions to address climate change, and needed reforms of the economic and political systems. This causes public trust in democracy to drastically decline. Left unchecked, gerrymandering threatens to permanently undermine democratic fairness, making elections mere formalities rather than true expressions of the people's will.

Gerrymandering is clearly part of a broader systemic effort to corrode democracy, and is not an isolated issue. Dysfunction and division are not accidental but engineered tools of authoritarianism, making it clear that fixing gerrymandering is critically important to restoring democratic fairness and effective good governance.

Global Lessons: How Authoritarians Seize and Destroy Democracies

The Authoritarian Playbook is not unique to the U.S. It has been deployed repeatedly throughout history by autocrats seeking to undermine democracy from within.

In fascist Italy and Nazi Germany during the 1920s through the end of World War II, democratic institutions were destroyed. Benito Mussolini and Adolf Hitler grabbed power through more-or-less legal means, exploiting economic crises and public discontent.

They used nefarious tactics, demonizing political opponents and scapegoating minorities, weakening legislative bodies to consolidate power, and controlling the media and spreading devious propaganda and disinformation.

This authoritarian blueprint was also seen in action in Russia, when Vladimir Putin imposed modern autocratic control by rigging elections and silencing opposition through legal maneuvers and violence. He stimulated nationalist feelings and promoted propaganda to justify crackdowns on dissent. Wealth was consolidated among oligarchs and insiders, ensuring that a ruling elite would remain in power indefinitely. This has woeful impacts on the people!

In Hungary and Turkey, democracy has also been significantly eroded. Viktor Orbán in Hungary and Recep Erdogan in Turkey have both followed the Authoritarian Playbook, using fear, nationalism and control over the media and the judiciary to dismantle democracy piece by piece.

On March 19, 2025, Erdogan provoked a democratic emergency in Turkey by arresting the popular Mayor of Istanbul, Ekram Imamoglu. This is a cowardly dictator move to prevent the leader of the democratic opposition in Turkey from running for president, for Erdogan is afraid to hold free and fair elections.

There are key lessons in these examples for the United States. Autocrats don't always take power in a coup -- they sometimes dismantle democracy more gradually. Judicial and electoral integrity are always among the first targets of authoritarian control, along with control of the media and the insidious propagation of deceitful propaganda.

It seems clear that autocrats everywhere are becoming more emboldened because they know that they will encounter no real consequences from the Trump-Musk-Vance administration for their aggressions. They know that the United States government is currently on a rampage, trying to destroy democracy at home and around the world.

As the esteemed journalist Dan Rather wrote in *The Truth Dies with Him: Another voice didn't tow the Trump line*, "In another sad-but-true-to-form attempt by Donald Trump to silence the truth, he's gutted a federal agency that broadcasts news around the world -- because it wasn't pro-Trump news or Fox propaganda, but pro-democracy journalism that provides information to parts of the globe where a free press is threatened or nonexistent. He signed an executive order that effectively shuttered the U.S. Agency for Global Media. This is an umbrella organization for federally funded news outlets like Voice of America, which collectively reach 420 million people, in 100 countries, in 63 languages, and have the purpose of aiding American diplomacy by extolling the tenets of democracy.

History teaches us that democracy is fragile. The U.S. is being rudely shown to be very vulnerable to the forces that have led other nations into authoritarian despotism. The current threats to democratic fairness include voter suppression laws passed by Republicans to benefit them over more centrist and more progressive Democrats. Attacks on the judicial system and media are being amplified, and checks and balances are being undermined. And disinformation, conspiracy theories and anti-democratic propaganda are being ramped up in the Conservative Media Complex. Government is being captured by corporate interests and those with Big Money, much of it spent in secret.

However, history also shows that resistance and reform are possible. The U.S. has overcome oligarchy, segregation and corporate dominance before, but only when citizens rise up to demand fairness, justice and accountability for abuses of power and violations of law and the Constitution. "Let's just do it!"

Democracy is a Choice

The struggle between democracy and authoritarianism is becoming intense. The Authoritarian Playbook is in motion, but history offers a roadmap for resisting it.

The choice is clear: Will we allow our democracy to erode under the weight of corruption, suppression and fear? Or will we fight to preserve the ideals of fairness, justice and democratic governance?

The answer to this question will define the future of America -- and the fate of democracy itself.

The Great Value of Good Governance and Democratic Accountability

At the heart of any thriving democracy is a government that serves the people with integrity, transparency and a commitment to justice. Good governance is not merely a matter of competent administration -- it is also a serious moral responsibility. The Founders understood the dangers of unchecked power, which is why they designed a system built on separation of powers, the rule of law, and democratic accountability.

When leaders abuse their authority, deceive the public, engage in historical revisionism that distorts history, and manipulate the levers of power for personal and partisan gain, democracy itself is placed in grave peril.

Authoritarian tendencies thrive when citizens are distracted, divided and disillusioned. Apathy and misinformation are tools of those who seek to usurp and abuse power.

There are huge risks in having leaders who engage in authoritarianism and bad governance. When politicians distort history, they often do so to curtail democratic fairness and torpedo democracy.

The Trump regime in 2025 is a textbook case of authoritarian corruption, because it is deploying many ruses to mislead the American people, fundamentally betraying democratic principles in order to consolidate power and ruthlessly sabotage the tenets of good self-government. Exposing and resisting these deceptions is not just a political necessity -- it is a moral imperative.

Good governance is rooted in the idea that leaders should act in the public interest, not for self-enrichment or partisan entrenchment.

All of the principles set forth in the Constitution's Preamble are actively undermined by the corrupt and deceitful practices of authoritarian leaders. The Trump regime, rather than upholding these ideals, has weaponized government institutions, embraced corruption, and turned public policy into a tool of self-serving manipulation.

Instead of promoting the general welfare, Trump and his co-conspiring allies are engineering economic policies that enrich the wealthiest while leaving working Americans struggling with rising costs and declining opportunities.

Instead of establishing justice, Trump has stacked the judiciary with political partisans and ideological loyalists, protecting corporate and political elites from accountability while dismantling protections for ordinary citizens.

Instead of ensuring domestic tranquility, Trumpian rhetoric and actions stoke division, resentment and fear, pitting Americans against each other.

Instead of providing for the common defense, domestic policy has been militarized while Trump is cozying up to autocratic foreign leaders and abandoning NATO allies, putting our national security in unnecessary jeopardy.

Instead of securing liberty, they have pursued voter suppression, judicial manipulation, and authoritarian rule-by-fiat, seeking to rig the system in their favor permanently.

This fundamental betrayal of democratic values needs to be more clearly exposed, and opposed with principled resistance.

Exposing the Deceptions of 2025: The High Cost of Authoritarian Manipulation

The Trump regime operates not on truth, but on deception. In 2025, the American people are being bombarded with ruses designed to justify authoritarian control and hide corruption -- and distract from the disastrous consequences of the administration's policies. Among the most egregious ruses being perpetrated are:

1. The Tariff Ruse: A Hidden Tax on the American People. Trump's protectionist tariffs are marketed as "common sense" economic nationalism, but they serve as a backdoor tax on consumers that raises prices on imported goods. While he deviously claims that tariffs make America stronger, the real impact is to increase costs for American families, particularly on imports like oil, automobiles, electronics and food. This is pathetically accompanied by economic turmoil for industries dependent on imports, especially agriculture and manufacturing.

It is clear that one of the main purposes for tariffs is to basically raise billions of dollars in government revenues -- not to help struggling workers -- but to partially offset the cost of huge tax cuts for corporations and the ultra-rich. Additionally, trade wars harm global alliances and destabilize economies.

Rather than defending American jobs, tariffs are being used as a manipulative tool to extract money from the public while rewarding corporate elites and Trump's political allies.

2. The Tax Cut Ruse: A Giveaway to the Rich Disguised as Economic Relief. Trump and his cronies continue to falsely claim that tax cuts for corporations and the wealthy will "trickle down" to benefit working Americans, despite decades of evidence proving otherwise. The tax policies being pushed by Republicans in Congress will result in ballooning deficits that rationalize a need to make cuts to Medicare, Medicaid, Social Security and many vital public services.

A deepening wealth gap will give more power to those in the top 1%, while leaving the middle and working classes increasingly vulnerable. Workers will experience stagnant wages, while CEOs and billionaires will be able to continue hoarding profits.

Trump's tax policies are not about economic growth -- they are about further enriching the rich at the expense of the vast majority of Americans. This will harmfully serve to further entrench oligarchy.

3. The Voting Rights Ruse: Suppressing the Vote to Secure Permanent Power. Framing voter suppression as "election integrity" is one of Trump Republicans' most pernicious deceptions. Under the guise of preventing nearly nonexistent voter fraud, Trump's allies have restricted mail-in voting, early voting and registration access. This disproportionately disadvantages young voters and people in racial minorities and the poor -- along with all the many millions of citizens who fail to vote.

And Republicans are also working maniacally to empower state legislatures to overturn election results they don't like, creating a system where political power -- not the voters -- determines outcomes. And they continue to get away with gerrymandering districts so aggressively that many elections are effectively decided before votes are even cast.

By eroding free and fair elections, Trump is laying the groundwork for merciless authoritarian rule. This is not good!

4. The "Law and Order" Ruse: Criminalizing Dissent While Enabling Corruption. Trump's selective use of "law and order" rhetoric and actions exposes his fundamental contempt for justice. His administration is targeting political opponents and journalists, using the Department of Justice, the FBI and the legal system to silence critics, and encouraging law enforcement crackdowns on protests and protestors, branding dissenters as domestic threats. Corrupt allies will be shielded from legal consequences, ensuring that loyalty to Trump outweighs accountability under the law.

This isn't "law and order" -- it's authoritarian repression in the devious guise of national security and other rationales.

This poignant perspective on the four worst ruses being perpetrated by the Trump regime in 2025 is focused on the urgent necessity of exposing and resisting authoritarian deceptions and the most egregious manipulations, false narratives, and abuses of power being carried out right now.

This hard-hitting takedown of Trump's most dangerous lies and policy ruses is based on facts, evidence and reason, and is framed in the context of the moral and democratic imperative to fight back. It connects Trump's tactics to the historical Authoritarian Playbook, as discussed above, and reinforces the idea that his Administration's actions are not isolated but part of a dangerous and well-worn path toward the erosion of democratic fairness. The Trump regime's ruses threaten democracy, justice and the economy -- using misinformation to control the narrative and intimidation and force to suppress dissent.

The Trump administration is also manipulating the judiciary by stacking courts with political partisans, and beginning to ignore and defy court orders, and taking advantage of rulings by Trump-appointed judges that let them get away with abuses of power. And Trump is weaponizing executive power by issuing executive orders to undercut big law firms if they dare to be involved in lawsuits that would hold Trump and his allies accountable for violations of laws, regulations or the U.S. Constitution.

The urgent need for public awareness and resistance is becoming glaringly clear. Trumpian deceptions must be countered through civic engagement and protests, and by demanding greater transparency, paying attention to good investigative journalism, and supporting fair-minded legal action.

The Strikingly Polarized Partisan Divide

Recent polling data indicates that Trump's approval rating stands at 47%, with a unprecedented partisan divide: 90% of Republicans supposedly approve of his performance, while only 4% of Democrats do. This aligns with earlier reports, confirming the deep polarization in opinions on Trump and his administration.

The deep partisan divide in Trump's approval ratings is driven by several key factors:

1. Partisan Loyalty and Polarization - The modern Republican Party remains largely aligned with Trump, as he continues to dominate its direction, messaging and aggressive actions. Conversely, Democrats overwhelmingly oppose him due to his policies, rhetoric, lawlessness, and past and current actions.
2. Policy Decisions - Trump's aggressive executive actions and legislative priorities -- such as his tax plans, deregulatory offensives, evisceration of federal agencies, and deportations of immigrants without due process -- appear to appeal strongly to conservatives, while drastically offending and alienating liberals.
3. Media Consumption and Echo Chambers - Right-leaning media largely portrays Trump's presidency positively, while left-leaning outlets emphasize scandals, controversies and rapidly increasing opposition. These things reinforce conflicted partisan opinions.
4. Democratic Backlash - Many Democrats see Trump as a direct threat to democracy, citing his role in past election controversies and efforts to consolidate and abuse executive power. This near-universal opposition results in his historically low approval among Democrats.
5. Economic and Social Factors - While some Americans view Trump's economic policies favorably, concerns over issues like tariffs on imports, cuts to social programs, offensives against civil rights, and abandoning traditional democratic allies fuel strong opposition from liberals and moderates.

This extreme polarization isn't new, but it has dramatically intensified in 2025, contributing to this unprecedented divide in Trump's approval ratings along party lines.

It appears that this stark divide is a new dimension of conservative glee at "owning the libs", no matter how contrary the outcomes are to the general welfare, or how twisted by propaganda, misinformation and ignorance in conservative echo chambers -- and despite the extreme Trumpian lack of empathy and the terrible treatment, contempt and disregard being given to civil servants, women, gay people, undocumented immigrants, poor people and people of color.

A Parable -- The Gilded Rooster and the Walled City

In a land where the sun bathed golden fields and rivers shimmered like silver serpents, there stood a great walled city -- a city built upon the foundations of justice, where the voices of the many wove the fabric of fair-minded self-rule, and where the weak were shielded from the excesses of the strong. Its people called it Demosia, the City of the Free.

But beyond the walls, in the dust and the shadows, there strutted a gaudy, gilded rooster named Vainglorius. Publicly funded, independent journalism should be expanded to ensure a better diversity and accuracy of reporting. In this regard, funding for PBS and NPR should be increased, not eliminated.

Social Media platforms should be better regulated to combat disinformation, prevent the proliferation of hate speech, and remove demonstrably false election and health-related disinformation that threatens public safety.

Transparency should be increased in political advertising on television on digital platforms.
